### Government confirms funding for the new Princess Alexandra Hospital



The government has confirmed the funding and timetable for a new, state-of-the-art hospital for Harlow, following a review of its New Hospital Programme (NHP). The NHP will now be delivered in waves of investment, with The Princess Alexandra Hospital NHS Trust (PAHT) falling into wave two. Schemes in wave two are expected to begin construction between 2030 and 2035. PAHT has been advised it can plan to begin construction in Harlow from 2032.

In October 2019, the government first announced that PAHT would receive funding to build a new hospital in Harlow for its patients, community, and people. Since that time, PAHT, along with other trusts, has been working closely with the NHP team to develop a framework for the building of all the new hospitals in the national programme, including design, the procurement of contractors, and how to best use modern methods of construction so the new hospitals can be built faster, better, and more efficiently.

Yesterday's announcement (20 January) is a significant delay to the original plans for a new Princess Alexandra Hospital, but it does provide certainty that there will be a new hospital during the next decade.

PAHT will continue to work closely with the national programme team to ensure plans for the new hospital are robust and that the necessary land is acquired.

Hattie Llewelyn-Davies, chair of PAHT, and Thom Lafferty, chief executive at PAHT, said: "We are pleased that the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, the Rt Hon Wes Streeting, has confirmed the government's commitment to a new hospital for Harlow. His statement provides much-needed certainty to our people and our patients.

"The new hospital will provide an incredible opportunity to transform the care we deliver to our local populations, responding to local need.

"In the meantime, our ageing hospital estate continues to face significant and ongoing problems. Now that the start of construction for our new hospital has been delayed until 2032, we will work with system and NHS England colleagues to ensure we can maintain safe and effective facilities for our patients and staff across our current sites in the meantime.

"We would like to thank our people, our patients, our partners, and our local communities for their continued support."

#### **MUSIC FOR MEMORIES**

Linda looks at how music and singing helps patients



If you happen to be at PAH on a Friday afternoon, you may see the unusual sight of a keyboard on a hospital trolley, complete with fairy lights, being wheeled along the corridors en route to the wards, bringing music to patients with dementia!

In 2019, Caroline Ashton-Gough, Admiral nurse and dementia clinical nurse specialist at PAH, asked if I would like to help her organise musical afternoons for patients with dementia. We did and we call ourselves 'Music for Memories'.

It has been shown that music can bring many benefits for people with dementia, including helping to reduce anxiety and lifting mood.

Initially, we led sessions in Gibberd ward, a palliative care and dementia care ward. We wanted to create a warm, friendly environment, where patients, families and staff could relax and express their emotions through music. With the help of other volunteers, these afternoons soon developed into 'Fun Friday' with simple chair exercises, familiar songs from various decades, with lots of clapping and swaying and of course no afternoon was complete without tea and cake!

Family members were often delighted and visibly moved to see loved ones participating and remembering all the words of a song!



The social effect of music in a group is clearly evident. A song may trigger a memory, perhaps a family event, going dancing on a Saturday night or singing in a choir at the Royal Albert Hall.

Patients have also asked to sing a solo ... 'Scarlet Ribbons' was one which was particularly moving and stands out in our minds. It was wonderful!

During lockdown, we continued our sessions as best we could on zoom and I played the piano at home.

Since then, we have had to adapt our sessions, as patients with dementia are now located all over the hospital.

Our afternoons have become more patient led. We choose a bay of up to four patients and are able to spend more time focusing on individuals.

Talking one to one with them may trigger a memory of a person, an event a song, which we then sing. We often search for a particular song/music on our phones too. It's all very spontaneous, often moving, we never know what our afternoons will bring.... but it really does work! It is interesting to observe how staff also benefit from our sessions. They often come searching for where the music is coming from and will join in for a few minutes if they have time!

Caroline and I often say how privileged we feel to be allowed into patients' lives, at such a difficult and challenging time for them. Hopefully, we are able to create some happy moments for them and their families.

## President awarded a BEM SEPITAL BROADCASTING ASSOCIATION

The Hospital Broadcasting Association (HBA) is delighted to share the news that its President, June Snowden, has been awarded a British Empire Medal (BEM) for services to Hospital, Health and Wellbeing Broadcasting in HM The King's New Year Honours List 2025.

June has been a loyal volunteer, supporter and advocate for hospital, health and wellbeing broadcasting for over 50 years, devoting much of her life to the national cause.



June met her late husband, Brian, who was one of the founding members of the National Association of Hospital Broadcasting Associations in April 1970 (NAHBO). Today, it is known as the Hospital Broadcasting Association (HBA).

On receiving her nomination, June Snowden said: "I am delighted, thrilled and humbled to accept the BEM Award."

"My passion for hospital broadcasting in whatever form it moves forward will always continue. It is and will continue to be a major part of my life."

#### **New Therapeutic Garden**

New therapeutic gardens are being developed at PAHT thanks to a grant of £88,000, thanks to a successful bid to NHS Charities Together, match funded by the PAH Charity.

The plan is to develop a number of gardens including:

A sensory garden, near Oslo House. to support patients living with dementia and other sensory needs. A garden of reflection, at the back of the Sanctuary. Also a Garden for our people, near Parndon Hall. An open space for staff working at the hospital to reenergise and reflect.

Following a successful bid to NHS Forestry, over 130 trees and 2,000 shrubs, have also been secured for PAHT, some of which will be used for the therapeutic garden developments.
